The Foundation has had another successful year assisting in the education of isolated and disadvantaged young people from remote areas of NSW and the border areas of adjoining states. Again this has involved providing bursaries to assist with school boarding fees, and scholarships for undergraduates at Charles Sturt University.

We have seen a significant increase in the number of secondary bursary applications in 2018 which can be directly attributed to the increasing spread of drought conditions in western NSW.

### **AGM and Board Meetings**

# **Secondary Bursaries 2018**

This year we have received 33 applications for secondary bursaries and of these 19 were new applicants. We awarded 28 Secondary Boarding Bursaries that met our strict evaluation and selection criteria.

Preliminary reports from the schools where our bursary students are placed indicate that our standards for performance are being maintained.

### **Scholarships at Charles Sturt University**

Our support for Scholarships at Charles Sturt University has been maintained at four this year with all students funded by BCEF. All of our scholarship recipients have again achieved very high academic levels with a grade point average of 5.65 out of 7.0.

This year's BCEF Scholar is Cara Earlam who is studying Veterinary Science at the CSU Wagga campus. She has an excellent ATAR mark and should prove a very worthy BCEF Scholar.

## **Drought and Climatic Conditions**


Requests for support from the BCEF are always higher in drought times and today is no exception with the NSW Department of Primary Industries declaring the central-west and central tablelands as being under drought watch. The ABC Central West has reported farmers across the central-west are battling what is being described as the driest period in at least a decade. Some areas have received around only a third of their average rainfall, with Orange recording just 99 millimetres of rain so far in 2018.

#### **Funding Packages for our Donors**
